In linguistics, a <u>semantic role</u> is a role that the arguments (subject, object) play in a sentence. Look at the examples of five semantic roles presented in the table below:

An agent – an initiator or doer of the action. It should be alive and able to make a conscious decisions.	e.g.: <i>Jack</i> was running.
An experiencer – it experiences some state. It may be a subject but also an object. It is characterised as "aware of something".	e.g.: <i>Jean</i> felt cold.
A goal – the entity towards which the motion proceeds.	e.g.: John threw the ball to the basket.
An instrument – whatever is being used to perform the action.	e.g.: Mum chopped the tomato with a knife.
A source – indicates the place or object where the movement expressed by the verb starts.	e.g.: John received the book <i>from Mary</i>
